The First KSHA Hosted Show this year was a Success!

The show was a lot of work but a lot of fun! We had 30 horses attend and 180 class entries! All positions were volunteers except the judge and when I told her what our goals were for this year, she even gave us a discount!

First, I want to thank our volunteers: Diana VanDyke and Terry Craft announced, Jasmine Pumphrey ran the show office, CJ Bickham (former youth member) was ring steward, Joanna and BJ Tillman took charge of set up and breakdown of obstacles, and Jenny Bormann and her kids ran the gate. We broke the sessions into morning and evening to try and avoid the hot part of the day and it seemed to work for the most part.

Saturday Morning session ended between 1 and 2. We then had a Jr activity that was open to anyone that wanted to participate. Jr's were making bracelets and key chains to sell at the next show. Most of them sold right then!! I don't have the numbers as Bailey is out of town but will get that information out when we can. Part of the activity was that the Jr's were going to get a hotdog meal paid for out of their last money-making activity but when it came time to pay the bill, The Casual Corner picked up the entire tab! The Saturday Evening session then picked up around 5:30 and was over around 7ish I believe. One of the highlights of each session was handing out the gift certificates for Casual Corner and Mid-Kansas Tack and Saddle that were donated by Michelle White. Thank you, Michelle! We awarded two high point awards, one for an adult and one for a youth. The award was 1 free stall at the Salina show in September. Pre-entries are not required but appreciated and you can add classes at the show. Gate entries are allowed but if you enter the class you will be charged for the class. If you are going to use your own number please list that below. Numbers are on the horse.

class # Explanation of fun classes!

- 17 Showmanship Swap: You will get a horse at the gate! Let's see your skills with a horse you have never shown! Don't forget to bring your showmanship horse with you as someone else will be showing your horse! Judged exactly like a showmanship class. If you are a beginner showmanship exhibitor, this will not affect your status! (management will approve horses) Judged like a regular showmanship class. No horse, talk to the office!
- 27 Simon Says: We will keep it w/t friendly. If the judge does ask for a canter/lope then the walk/trot participants will just do an extended trot unless they feel comfortable in the canter/lope. This will not affect your beginner status! If you miss a command you are out. Last person on the rail wins!
- 35 Egg and Spoon: You will be provided with an egg and a spoon in the arena. You will hold the handle of the spoon and you are not to touch the egg. The last person that still has the egg in their spoon is the winner.
- 40 Freestyle Reining: You have 3 minutes to perform a routine of your own making. Music and costumes are encouraged but now required. Judged on originality.
- 50 Steady Eddy: You will be provided a cup with water. At the end of the class, whoever has the most water in the cup wins. You can not hold the cup by the top, only by the side or bottom.

Remember, this show is to support our Junior members and our scholarship fund. We have many people that we already need to thank. Our judge, announcer, and office manager are all supporting our show by donating their time. The arena is a free will donation that we will honor with part of our profits and arena donations and everyone helping out at the arena and concession are all volunteers. We want to thank everyone for your help in making this a fun show and helping our Jr's get some funds in their account. We are still looking for prize donations for our classes. Any little bit helps!!
